PLANT FOSSILS FROM THE TARLTON RANGES, N. TERRITORY

Specimens containing fragmentary plant remains were collected at two localities in the Tarlton Ranges, N. Territory by E. Smith and R. Vine in 1959.

The specimens from locality T 343 contain the following plant fragments:-

- a. Small, branching rootlets.
- b. Several small impressions of bits of ribbed Equisetalean stems.
- c. An indeterminate wood impression.
- d. Indeterminate stem impressions.
- e. One small stem impression showing segmentation of the type which occurs in Vertebraria, the stem associated with Glossopteris. Preservation is very poor and no determination is possible.

No age determination can be made.

At Locality T 344 there are casts of indeterminate stems, some of which are hollow.
