## REPORT ON A SARRAR OF DIAMERICA PROM VICTORIA.

## Record He. 1950/12.

The sample of treated distomite submitted by the Deputy Director for micropalaeontological examination consists of communited fragments of frustules of distoms. However, many genera can be recognised.

The genera consist of the best-chaped Cymbolls, Comphonens and Mayicule, the long overte Finanteria, the seedle shaped Syncire and Mitschia, rod-like Sunctia, Spithese and Fragellaria and the cylindrical Soloties.

Re indication of the locality of this distomite is given but it most probably same from Victoria. It is of freshwater origin and the variety of shape and size of the distoms suggest that this rock should be suitable for filtration purposes.
