MICRO-EXAMINATION OF FURTHER SAMPLES FROM THE CURRAGUNDI BORE,
35 MILES S.W. OF MUNGUNDI, NORTHERN NEW SOUTH WALES.

(Report No.1945/19).

The samples from the Curragundi Bore, examined for micro-fauna, were taken from the depths of 2,110 feet down to 3,533 feet 11 inches. The series is in continuation of that reported upon 11/10/44, when the last sample examined was from the depth of 2,107 feet 6 inches.

The material consists almost entirely of unconsolidated sandstone, with some carbonaceous particles at 3,450 and 3,533 feet, and is unfossiliferous. No micro fossils have been recorded in the above since 1,150 feet. There is no evidence present to indicate the age of the beds.
