Please ensure that all entries are submitted in class groups by the school, and that they include the student's name, and a contact name and phone number of the teacher-in-charge. Winners will be invited to attend a prize giving ceremony during Earth Science Week, possibly with the involvement of our Parliamentary Secretary. A note for parents of prize winners requesting permission for their child to be photographed by media will be provided prior to the event.
