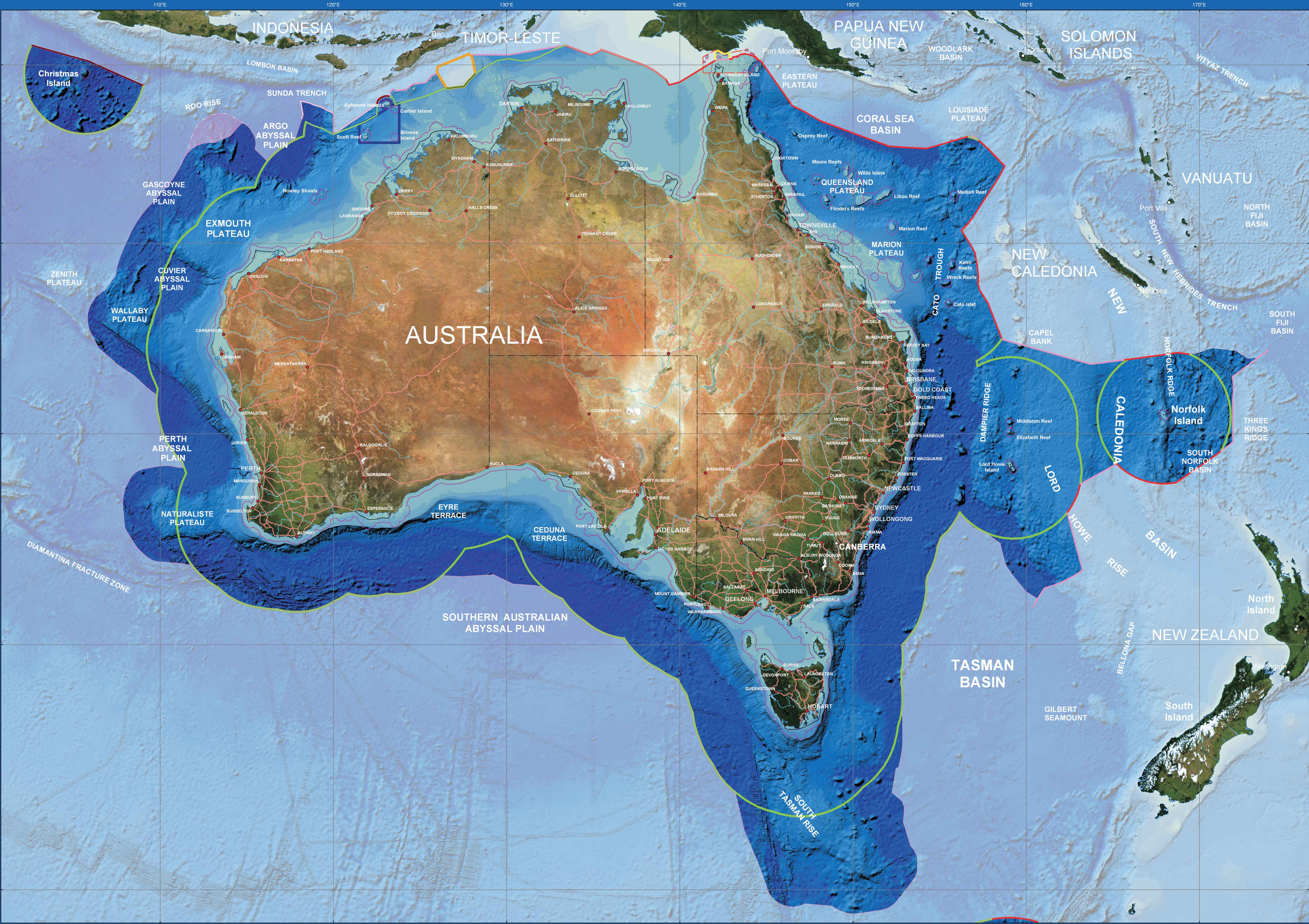


Australia's Maritime Jurisdiction around Australia



- Those parts of Australia's territorial sea baseline that traverse water
- Australia's territorial sea limit
- Australia's exclusive economic zone limit
- Provisional Water Column Jurisdiction Line, CMATS Treaty
- Exclusive economic zone treaty boundary with an opposite or adjacent State, signed but not ratified
- Exclusive economic zone and continental shelf treaty boundary with an opposite or adjacent State
- Exclusive economic zone and continental shelf treaty boundary with an opposite State which is co-extensive with an exclusive economic zone boundary with the same State under a treaty that is signed but not yet ratified
- Outer limit of Australia's continental shelf
- Outer limit of extended continental shelf yet to be resolved (including Australian Antarctic Territory where Australia requested the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf not consider this region for the time being and areas of potential delimitation)
- Continental shelf treaty boundary with an opposite or adjacent State
- Continental shelf treaty boundary with an opposite or adjacent State, signed but not ratified

- Fisheries Jurisdiction Line as defined in the Treaty between Australia and Papua New Guinea
- Protected Zone as defined in the Treaty between Australia and Papua New Guinea
- Limit of Joint Petroleum Development Area as defined in the Timor Sea Treaty between Australia and Timor-Leste
- Limit of the area covered by the MOU between Australia and Indonesia regarding the Operations of Indonesian Traditional Fishermen in Areas of the Australian Exclusive Fishing Zone and Continental Shelf

Depiction of Marine Areas

Clear regions on this map depict areas where Australia exercises water column, seabed and subsoil jurisdiction, seabed and subsoil jurisdiction only, or fisheries jurisdiction only, as defined in certain treaties.

Light pink shading depicts areas submitted and yet to be resolved (including Australian Antarctic Territory where Australia requested the Commission on the Limits of the Continental Shelf not consider this region for the time being).

Light white shading depicts areas beyond Australian jurisdiction.

QUALIFICATIONS RELATING TO THIS MAP:

- This map is indicative only of the location of the territorial sea baselines and the outer limits of Australia's maritime zones, and should NOT be used as a definitive source of information. Some limits may be subject to change.
- The territorial sea boundaries and certain maritime zones are established under the Seas and Submerged Lands Act 1973.
- Waters adjacent to Australia's internal waters are internal waters of Australia for the purposes of international law. They do not equate with waters within the limits of the states of the Northern Territory for constitutional purposes. The extent of the latter waters is determined by the letters Patent relevant to each state and the Northern Territory and the common law.
- Certain limits and boundaries are established under various treaties with neighbouring States (not all are in force).
- Limits of coastal waters adjacent to each of the Australian States and of the Northern Territory are established under the Coastal Waters (State Powers) Act 1980, Coastal Waters (Northern Territory Powers) Act 1980 and the Offshore Petroleum and Greenhouse Gas Storage Act 2006.
- This map has been prepared taking into account the obligations of Australia under the Timor Sea Treaty and the Treaty with Timor-Leste concerning Certain Maritime Arrangements in the Timor Sea. Therefore, the map does not present all areas in which Australia may assert a continental shelf jurisdiction.
- In the event of an inconsistency between this map and the territorial sea boundaries or limits established under Australian legislation or the treaties, then the legislative instruments or the treaties shall prevail.
- Except as required by law, the Commonwealth will not be liable for any loss, damage, expense or cost (including any indirect or consequential loss or damage) incurred by any person or organization arising out of use of, or reliance on, this map.
